

At Least You Won't Fall Down the Stairs

With steps on the winding staircases this narrow, it's a good thing the drinks aren't strong. Situated in a renovated shikumen building in the rapidly expanding Bohemian Taikang Lu, this bar aims to cash in on the burgeoning community. The interior decoration is tasteful with wooden floors complementing the white washed brick of the building, and the second floor features a

funky steated dining area and a bar. there are only three whites. A suc-A room with a low ceiling on the third floor houses another seating area. On the walls hang pictures of old China and films ranging from the old classics to the latest Chinese blockbusters are projected above the bar. Drink prices are expensive. Their extensive French red wine selection goes for an exorbitant ¥80 per glass (bottles ¥240-1,080) and

cession of cocktails were very weak. A Singapore Sling (¥60) tasted overly sweet and was full of ice as was a Yellow Mellow (¥60). Service was patchy and the bar seemed to be out of many items. Our coffee was perhaps the saving grace.

Ode to the Geman Beer Gods

Bavaria's world-famous Staatliches Hof Brauhaus has graced Pudong with a new temple to honor the German beer gods. At first, we were dismayed to find that they only offered four different house-brewed beers: dunkel, wheat, lager and a seasonal brew. However, after sampling a couple of half liters we soon realized that quality trumps quantity—every single one of these beers was excellent! They also accommodate light weights and veterans alike with three different serving sizes ranging from ¥48-108. The menu, although a tad pricey, offers a full range of traditional German fare from sausages to strudels. And what evening of Teutonic tippling would be complete without pretzels? Warm, soft and ¥10 each, they'll soak up enough alcohol so you can quaff more beer. Hof Brauhaus is a godsend to our neighbors in Pudong and well worth the trip across the river for those of us in Puxi.
